## **Only Recorded Complete Set**

While the Essays show an intent, or at least a contemplation to print both an 8c and 32c stamp, neither was ever issued. There was a logical basis for printing an 8c stamp. This had been a standard value for the Philippines since 1901, and would have been used to pay the double weight first class rate (1-2 oz.) to the United States and possessions and to the Spanish-American Postal Union countries, as well as the Sample of Merchandise rate (8c/100g) in all foreign countries. However, at no time had there previously been a 32c value printed in the Philippines. While that value could have been used to pay the first class rate to a foreign destination for 41-60g, there was no precedent for the value and it would have been surplusage. Ultimately, only one 32c stamp was ever issued during the U.S. Possession and Commonwealth periods 1899-1946, and that was in 1932. Even then, the stamp saw little use until the advent of overseas airmail service in 1935.
