## 1 PESO ROSE-LILAC POSTAL HISTORY



Manila to Kingston, Jamaica, Dec. 15, 1935  
P1.50 "Clipper" rate to U.S., 1-15 grams, 20c Airmail Rate, U.S. to Jamaica, to ½ oz.

*Only Example Recorded to Destination*

The One Peso stamp served a limited postal service, with its likely intended use being philatelic sales and high profit for the Bureau of Posts. However, the stated purpose was for the posting of large packages and overweight envelopes. There are only *Five Commercial Covers Recorded* with postage paid using the One Peso stamp. *All Five Covers are in this Exhibit.* For all of the covers but one, the stamp paid multiples of the First Class Rate on large envelopes. It is only the small cover on this page, which was mailed shortly after airmail service began in the Philippines (Dec. 2, 1935), which utilized the high value rate for a more standard size cover.
