For purposes of this rate, Second Class mail is defined as "Newspapers, periodicals and regular publications entered as secondclass matter." The rate was 3 centavos for each pound or fraction thereof on that portion devoted to matter other than advertisements and 18 centavos for each pound or fraction on that portion devoted to advertisements.

While the return address on this cover is in Japan, research establishes the publisher also had a branch in Manila. The inquiry is relevant, as publications entered as second-class matter when sent by other than the publisher required an increased postage rate. In that circumstance, the second class mail rate was 4 centavos for each 2 ounces or fraction thereof, for weights not exceeding 8 ounces. And for weights of such matter exceeding 8 ounces, the rate was computed as fourth-class mail, which
