These same eight plates were used to print all of the 2c. red Rizals over the 10 years the stamp was placed in use.

The two centavos stamp paid internal first class (1-20g) and third class (1-60g) rates, as well as the post card rate both internally and to the United States and possessions. The two small size stamps in the series (2c. & 20c.) were printed in sheets of 400 with four plate numbers, and cut into four panes of 100 each with a single central plate number at top or bottom. All 14 stamps in this series were engraved, printed on a Flat Press, perforation 11, on unwatermarked paper. Regardless of the sheet size, cutting the sheet resulted in each pane having two sides with straight edges and two sides perforated through the selvedge. Guidelines and arrows are found in the selvedge directing the location of the pane division.
