Magenta handstamped in US, "Supposed to Contain
Matter Subject to the Provisions of Executive Order
8389 as Amended," which amended Executive
Order 6560, January 15, 1934, regulating
transactions in foreign exchange, transfers of
credit, and the export of coin and currency.

Order No. 8389, enacted April 10, 1940, prohibited
the countries of Norway or Denmark, or any national,
from transferring assets between those countries and
the U.S. The Order was almost immediately expanded
to cover every European country except the UK, as
well as China and Japan.

One of three large covers in this exhibit from the
Siedenburg correspondence. Carl Siedenburg was
the Far East agent for Janecke + Schneemann,
manufacturer of printing inks since 1843. Carl
resided in the Philippines, which always had a large
German population. Max Siedenburg was his son
who moved to the United States to attend school,
and settled in Del Mar, California.
