Five Examples Recorded

The 4c., 8c., 10c., 12c., 16c., 26c., and 30c. denominations were each printed in sheets of 200 and cut into panes of 50 with a single plate number at either the top or bottom of the pane.

Number Printed: 784,400

First Day of Issue: February 15, 1935



Only one plate was used to print the 10c. The "F" denotes a plate that is ready for hardening. Appears only on Flat Plates and generally precedes the plate number in the upper right pane of the sheet:

The ten centavos stamp paid the postcard rate to foreign destinations from 1935-1937.
