Manila to St. Gall, Switzerland, Feb. 6, 1941. (Honolulu, Feb. 11 - New York, Feb. 15. transit.) Rec. St. Gall, Mar. 4.  
12c. Foreign First Class, 1-20g, P1.60 "Two Ocean" Airmail to Europe via US, each 15g; 20c. Registry

The airmail rate from the Philippines to Europe via the U. S. was announced in Circular 36, on Sep. 8, 1939. The fee of P1.60 for every 15 grams or fraction thereof, provided air service across both the Pacific and Atlantic oceans, and was exclusive of ordinary postage. This route provided a faster, although more expensive alternative to the standard air rates via Singapore or Hong Kong.
