

Used to pay the First Class Rate, which was initially set by the Japanese Army at 2c. on March 4, 1942 and remained in effect until September 1, 1942 when the First Class Rate was raised to 5c., and the 2c. post card rate which remained in effect throughout the pendency of the Occupation. The only variation in these rates occurred during December of 1942 and 1943, when the Japanese lowered the First Class Rate to 2c. for all Christmas card mail (either envelope or post card).
