Issued to commemorate the 350th anniversary of the first printing press in the Philippines, and to cover the 12c. Registry Fee which had become effective March 1, 1943. "Limbagan" is the Tagalog word for "Printing Press." A single broken pane with 71 stamps remaining, together with three loose stamps from the same pane, bearing bottom Plate No. 131583, with doubling of the surcharge was discovered at the Manila Central Post Office by Ramon Catala and presented by him to Ellen Cass. It is presumed the other 26 stamps were used for First Day Covers or ordinary postage, but none has been reported. The doubling in the pane is progressive, with the upper stamps in the pane merely looking thicker, while the doubling is obvious in the lower stamps. Only 6 Copies are Recorded.
