Three Examples Recorded

(Listed by Balbino Cotter and Francisco de Quinto in "Catalogo Descriptivo de los Sellos de Correos, Telegrafos y Tarjetas Postales do las Islas Filipinas" (1895), who stated it was issued in 1881, and by Yvert (1975). A single with the overprint has also been recorded.)

The Type I overprinted stamps are the most difficult "Type" to acquire from the surcharge era. The only truly collectible stamp of the type is the red overprint on One Real Green revenue. And even for that stamp, there are probably less than 100 examples known. The grouping shown in this exhibit is the largest accumulation recorded. And, other than a single block of four owned by another collector, the pairs and blocks shown here are the only recorded multiples.
